

**Special Arrangements for the Aerobatic Display by the
Patrouille de France**

Traffic Arrangements

- To facilitate the arrival and dispersal of viewers, the police will implement special traffic arrangements with effect from 12 noon on the event day.
- The following special bus routes will be introduced on October 20:

From about 11 am to 1.30 pm

Route	Destination	Fare
61X	Admiralty MTR Station → Repulse Bay	\$8.0
62X	Admiralty MTR Station → Deep Water Bay	\$8.0

From about 12 noon to 1.30 pm

From 2.30 pm until crowds of spectators are dispersed

- For operational efficiency in the conveyance of spectators, no en-route stops will be provided on the above special bus routes. In

addition, regular services on bus routes 6, 6A, 6X, 63, 66, 73, 260 and 973 and green minibus routes 40 and 52 will be enhanced, subject to actual passenger demand.

- Members of the public wishing to take public transport towards Stanley from Repulse Bay will need to walk to the South Bay Roundabout.
- During the period when Island Road is re-routed one-way westbound, all journeys on bus routes 6A, 6X and 260 heading for Stanley are diverted via Stubbs Road, Wong Nai Chung Gap Road and Repulse Bay Road. All buses on routes 73 and 973 heading for Stanley will also be diverted via Nam Fung Road, Deep Water Bay Road and Repulse Bay Road.
- Under the special traffic arrangements, the taxi stands at Beach Road, No. 60 Repulse Bay Road and No. 33 Tai Tam Road as well as red minibus stands at Island Road and Beach Road will be suspended from noon until the crowds of spectators are dispersed. Taxis and red minibuses may pick up and set down passengers along Island Road and Repulse Bay Road outside restricted zones and beyond the limits of bus stops. However, they are not allowed to be held at the roadside to wait for passengers.
- All the roadside parking meters for motorcycles, private cars and coaches on Beach Road, South Bay Road and Nos. 29-33 Tai Tam Road will be temporarily closed. Those meters for private cars and motorcycle parking spaces along Island Road will also be suspended. Drivers are advised to drive their vehicles from the carparks before the

implementation of the special traffic arrangements.

- The Police will issue regular traffic bulletins through the electronic media. Members of the public should pay attention to such bulletins to keep abreast of the traffic condition and must refrain from dialing 999 for traffic information in order not to affect the emergency service.

Crowd Management

- In the event that the beaches are nearing capacity and that additional spectators may create a risk to public safety, the Police may stop people from entering the beaches and announcement will be made at bus termini and through the electronic media. The special bus routes to the beaches may be terminated.
- Following the conclusion of the show the departure of viewers on the beaches will be controlled and members of the public are advised to expect delays of up to three hours depending on how crowded the beaches are.
- Members of the public are advised to follow the direction of the police officers or public announcement during the dispersal phase.

Temporary Airspace Restriction

- An airspace of six nautical miles (11 km) radius from Ocean Park and from surface to 6000 ft will be reserved for the display. In certain periods in the afternoon of October 19 and 20, restrictions will apply to local flights within the display area and parts of the adjacent

airspace. Details have been promulgated to airspace users in an Aeronautical Information Publication Supplement No. C05/04.

Temporary Marine Restriction

- A marine closed area will be established from 1.30 pm to 3.30 pm on October 19 and 20. Vessels are prohibited from entering or staying within the closed area.
- During the closures of water area off Ocean Park, vessels departing from the Aberdeen South Typhoon Shelter should use the western entrance; whereas the southern entrance of the Aberdeen South Typhoon Shelter will be restricted to inbound traffic only.
- Details on the drawing of the closed area together with relevant control measures can be obtained from the Marine Department Notice (MDN) No. 138/2004.
